## NGO offers to conduct safety tests for Unilorin shuttle drivers

A non-governmental organization (NGO), known for providing support and care for victims of road accidents across Nigeria, The Good Samaritan Life Support Foundation, has offered to partner with the management of the University of Ilorin to conduct safety tests for shuttle drivers plying the campus route.

The offer was made last Monday (July 22, 2024) when the NGO's representatives visited the University's Vice Chancellor to extend condolences to the University community following a recent auto accident on campus.

In addition to organizing training sessions to equip the drivers with the necessary knowledge and skills that will ensure their road safety on and off the University campus, the NGO also donated the sum of N150,000 to help cover part of the costs incurred by victims of the accident.

The Convener of the Good Samaritan Life Support Foundation, Mr. Oriele Kayode, expressed deep sorrow over the incident, stating that the NGO felt the need to come and associate with the management of Unilorin.

Mr. Kayode highlighted the foundation's observations on safety gaps in Nigeria and explained the importance of protective measures to prevent future accidents. "From our experience, we have observed that there is a significant gap that well-to-do individuals and organisations need to fill within the community, especially concerning accident victims. When accidents happen, they can reduce victims to a state of



vegetables. The victims and the community need support at that critical time, and that is why we have come to identify with the Vice Chancellor and his management team".

Mr. Kayode, however, urged the enforcement of a 30-kilometer-per-hour speed limit within the campus, noting that this measure would be crucial in preventing future accidents and ensuring the safety of all students and staff.

While welcoming the representatives of the NGO to his office, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Egbewole, applauded the Good Samaritan Life Support Foundation for its worth of encouragement, as opposed to those who spread disinformation during a challenging time for parents and the University community.

The Vice Chancellor, who spoke through the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Olubummo Abayomi Daramola, said the accident was unfortunate and left every parent and the management and administration worried because all principal officers are also parents and grandmothers.

He, however, explained that measures are being put in place to

prevent future occurrences, adding that the University management is mindful of keeping the campus safe and ensuring all students return to their parents sound and healthy at the end of every school session.

The Vice Chancellor added that management would be glad to collaborate with the NGO in whatever ways necessary to attain more safety on the University campus.

Joining the Vice Chancellor to receive the team were the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Management Services), Prof. Suleiman Falorniyide Aribali; the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Adigboyege Adini Fawole; the Registrar, Mr. Musa Adeleke Afiania; and the University Librarian, Dr. Kajmaldeen Tunde Olokoju.

Other members of the NGO's entourage included the President and BOT Member, Prof. Olu Bisiola Benjamin; the State Coordinator, Eger Oyintola Yemi; the National Coordinator, Odebi Bola and the Director of Media and Publicity, Mr. Onibhio Samiel.

The celebration will mark a monumental juncture since the establishment of the University by a decree of the Federal Military Government in August 1973.

That 1973 decree, enacted to fulfil one of the educational objectives of the nation's Third National Development Plan, aimed to provide greater opportunities for Nigerians aspiring to earn a university degree and to produce the high-level workforce essential for the country's rapidly growing economy.

Over the past five decades, the University, recognized as the Most Outstanding Nigerian University of the Year 2023, has evolved from a modest institution into one of Nigeria's most renowned for academic excellence, innovative research, and community service. Besides being the most preferred university by admissions seekers for over ten years, it has also been deemed the most subscribed university in Nigeria by the international community.

This Golden Jubilee is a moment for the management past and present, absent staff, and current students, who uphold its motto "Proibus Doctrinae", to reflect on the University's rich history, achievements, and contributions to education and society. It will also be an occasion to pay tribute to the founding fathers who laid a solid foundation for the university and its successive administrations for their contributions to the advancement of this beloved institution.

The University of Ibadan began as a University College affiliated with the University of Ibadan, Nigeria's oldest

university, in 1973 under the leadership of Dr. T. N. Iloka. It attained full autonomy status in October 1977 with the appointment of its first Vice-Chancellor, Professor O. O. Akinlade. With 615 pioneering staff members, the first 200 students were admitted into three academic faculties Arts, Science, and Education. Following an entrance examination, students' activities commenced on October 25 after the Principal's address. Today, the University accommodates 50,000 students across 16 Faculties supported by 3,625 teaching and non-teaching staff.

The institution has produced governors, vice-chairmen, industry captains, entrepreneurs, leaders, trailblazers, and opinion leaders in diverse fields who have contributed to the growth and development of Nigeria, Africa, and the world. Notable alumni include the current Registrar of the Joint Admissions

and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and the first student to serve as Vice-Chancellor of his alma mater, Prof. Isiaka Obasaju Oloyele; the present Vice-Chancellor of Kwara State University, Maliki, and associate past Vice-Chancellor of the University of Abuja, Prof. Abdu Radheem No'Allah; the first woman neurosurgeon in West Africa, Dr. Salma Abubabbar Aliba; a banker and former acting Governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), Dr. Sanusi Abubabbar; the Director General of the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC); Dr. Hadiza Abubabbar; and a former Governor of Kwara State, Allou Abdulkarim Ahmed.

Others are a former Director General of the NPA and Coordinator of Nigerian Military Aviation, Major General Johnson Idowale Obasaju; the Executive Secretary/Chief Financial Officer of the National Primary Health Care Development Agency, Dr. Moye Adu; the first Unindigenous Parliament in West Africa and President of the Nigerian Society of Informatics and Computational Biology, Prof. Umar Fatai Adesua; a national human rights activist, Josephine Okojie Obasaju; a multiple award-winning investigative journalist, polemicist, and songwriter who is also the Group Head, Cinema & Public Affairs at TVC News, Buhari Eze Obigbo; the Minister of Youth of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Dr. Jumia Idris Ibrahim; and a versatile actor, producer, and film director, Mr. Femi Adesina. The list is endless.

Mr. Alfa, who expressed happiness with the recent positive ratings of the University by the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), particularly encouraged staff members to take their jobs with more seriousness for the institution to remain on top as it has been in the last 31 years.

## 4 Agric graduates get N6m BATF grants to start agribusiness

The British American Tobacco Nigeria Foundation (BATNF) has awarded N6 million to four outstanding graduates from the Faculty of Agriculture, University of Ibadan, as part of its Graduate Entrepreneur Programme.

The Graduate Entrepreneur Programme initiative aims to empower young entrepreneurs with grants, skills development, and mentorship, driving innovation and sustainability in Nigeria's agricultural sector.

At an event held last Tuesday (July 22, 2024) at Sankara Auditorium, Lafia, Faculty of Agriculture, eight applicants with compelling business plans were shortlisted following a rigorous selection process, and four outstanding entrepreneurs emerged as grant recipients.

They are Oladimeji Olajide Shafii, Muhammed Al-Mansyafie, Ibrahim, Oluseun Ogunmolu, and Amaelouape Akintunde, who graduated last month.

In his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Fagbowale, SAN, expressed his appreciation to the BATNF for selecting the University for participation in the agricultural entrepreneurship programme.

Represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Olutunde Owoade, the Vice-Chancellor said the five proposals by eligible graduates by providing essential resources and support to ensure their success in agriculture. "We want to prove to our graduates that no business venture is a futile career path," he affirmed.

He also expressed gratitude to the BATNF for bringing such a positive programme to the Nation. By far, institutions and nations the Foundation of the University's commitment to the project's success, adding that the initiative will further drive the food security in the country.

Speaking earlier, the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Prof. Olayemi Faniyi, noted that the primary objective of the collaboration between the University of Ibadan and the British American Tobacco Nigeria Foundation is to inspire and promote agricultural business among students.

She assured her audience that the Faculty will provide guidance for the winners as the recipients of the awards are expected to establish their bases on the University of Ibadan campus.

She said that the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with BATNF last year was aimed to drive an agricultural project demonstrating the viability of agriculture.

Prof. Faniyi noted that this ceremony marks the first cohort, with three additional cohorts planned for the future when facilities will also emerge.

The project, which will commence in a competition, aims to encourage senior graduates to venture into horticulture, crop production, and animal production within the University environment.

The Dean explained that the call for applications in June received 10 responses. After a thorough selection process, eight candidates were shortlisted to present their business proposals, and four winners were eventually chosen.

In his remarks, the General Manager of British American Tobacco

Nigeria Foundation, Mr. Oludare Odebiyi, pointed out that the Graduate Entrepreneur Programme initiative aims to empower young entrepreneurs with grants, skills development, and mentorship, driving innovation and sustainability in Nigeria's agricultural sector.

While congratulating the winners, Mr. Odebiyi reminded them that their innovative ideas and entrepreneurial spirit are a beacon of hope for the future of agriculture in Nigeria. Mr. Odebiyi, who spoke prominently about the need to cultivate interest in agriculture among the young people, pointed out that the aging farming population necessitates urgent action to achieve food security and sufficiency. "We want young graduates to become entrepreneurial entrepreneurs," he said.

Mr. Odebiyi praised the University of Ibadan for its support and enabling environment, which facilitated the successful launch of the project. He noted that the initiative had previously been instituted in the University of Ibadan and the Federal University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, but found a particularly conducive setting at Unilori.

The British American Tobacco Nigeria Foundation (BATNF) was established as an independent charity by British American Tobacco Nigeria in November 2002, with a starting grant of US\$1 million.

The event was attended by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Technology, and Innovation), Prof. Adesojiye Fadipe; the Registrar, Mr. Mameye Afolabi; PCIMI—the University Librarian; Dr. Kaisojeen Osopape; BATNF team; staff; and scholars of the Faculty of Agriculture.



## Imam-Fulani bags 'Young investigator Award' in USA

**A** Senior Lecturer at the Department of Physiology, Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences, College of Health Sciences, University of Ibadan, Dr Aminat Oluwalana Imam-Fulani, has won the "Young Investigator Award" at the recently concluded International Research Conference on Neurodegenerative Diseases (ICNDN) in Atlanta Georgia, USA.

The award, which was presented to Dr Imam-Fulani by the Global Association for the Study of Neurodegenerative Diseases (GASND), was one of the highlights of the programme held between July 12 and 16, 2024.

Dr Imam-Fulani, who is currently undergoing her postdoctoral fellowship at the Department of Neuroscience, University of Minnesota, was honored based on her contributions to a novel discovery and outstanding presentation of a work titled "Loss of Glycosidase-1 enhances neuroinflammation and

neurodegeneration independent of Abeta pathology in APPPS1 mice model of Alzheimer's disease".

According to the organizers, the findings of Dr Imam-Fulani and her group will be a beneficial exploration towards developing and enhancing therapies in

the treatment and management of Alzheimer's disease.

Meanwhile, the Provost, College of Health Sciences, University of Ibadan, Prof. Bisiola Sulaiman Alabi, has applauded the first award won by Dr Imam-Fulani, describing it as worthy of being celebrated.

- Take time to know an Association before you join it. In doubt, check with Student Affairs Unit.

- Do not leave valuables on your phone. It could make you a target of kidnapping or it could be an easy way for fraudsters to empty your account.
- Do not allow anyone to use your account or bank for a third party transaction.
- Do not use ATMs at remote places at night, as you could be exposed to attack, robbery or Kidnapping.
- Lock your door whenever you are leaving your room (even for a short time). Always lock your door when running or sleeping.

- Do not leave your wallet, purse, credit card, cash or other valuables in the open.
- Never lose your student ID Cards or anyone. If you misplaced it, report to the Division of Student Affairs and the Security Division immediately.
- Tell someone where you are going and when you can be expected or return.
- Always walk or jog in a familiar area and use well-lit paths. Avoid dark areas.
- Know your surroundings. If you suspect you are being followed, run in a different direction; go to the other side of the road or run to someone with illumination.
- Never leave your laptop computer, backpack, phone, or other valuables unattended or out of your sight in common areas.
- Avoid public toilets, or jutters, and board vehicles, only in approved parks.
- Choose your company of associates wisely to reduce your threat profile, as you might be exposed to threats through bad company.
- Do not walk alone, especially at night or before the day fully breaks, move in groups because there is a security in numbers.
