

#### Physical Sciences Faculty 'II remain on top, Alafara assures



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## Egbewole tasks CODL's e-tutors on effective service delivery

conscious. He noted that timely delivery is crucial in virtual education, unlike traditional in-person settings where time may be more flexible.

He said, "From interaction with people, emphasis has been placed on the fact that providing instructional materials for virtual learning is a very technical issue. Whatever we know now, I want to plead with you to equip yourselves with more training, ideas, and knowledge on providing instructional materials for virtual classrooms".

Earlier in her remarks, the Director of CODL, Prof. Modinah Adenike Abdul

Raheem, said that the e-tutors and efacilitators are integral to the unique mission of the CODL, which is to harness the potential of open and distance learning to bring quality education within the reach of all who seek it.

Prof. Abdul Raheem described the tutors as the connectors, facilitators, and the guides who will help the students navigate their educational journeys, adding that "this training has been meticulously designed to equip you with both the technical and pedagogical skills essential for delivering a world-class learning experience in a digital environment of Open and Distance Learning."

In the Inaugural Lecture, titled "The Matters of the Heart on the Survival of Animal and Man", the don, who is also the pioneer Head of the University's Department of Veterinary Physiology, said that giving the animals specific route across the country would ensure their safety and that of those who rear them.

She explained that continuous animal grazing along major highways should either be avoided or minimised as regular exposure to emissions from petroleum products such as diesel, petrol and kerosene has immeasurable adverse effects on human and animal health.


Prof. Azeez, who is also the first female Dean of the Faculty, said that the uncontrolled exposure of animals and man to emissions from petroleum products have been posing very serious cardiovascular challenges, which often result in sudden deaths.

She added that many sudden deaths are traceable to continuous exposure to petrol or diesel, saying that the consideration of the origin of some diseases show that they are environmentally induced.

The Dean, who has been a veterinary surgeon for four decades, equally appealed to the government and authorities of various institutions of higher learning to create hygienic

environment with zero tolerance for open-air emission of diesel engines and generators on their campuses so as to protect the lives of people working around the engines.

She also a p p e a l e d t o individuals to cultivate the habit of regular checks of blood pressure and other vital health parameters to avoid sudden d e a t h o r debilitating health conditions.



human and animal health.

She noted that both the leaves and seeds of Moringa are useful and that the Nigerian government should encourage the wide cultivation of the plant for general benefits

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## Yusuf, ex-Dean, PG School, bags FISN



Prof. Egbewole commended the Bank for its commitment to the project, noting that the smart ID cards would enable users to access facilities nationwide.

"This innovation aligns with our vision of ensuring that our community can operate securely and conveniently, both on and off campus," the Vice Chancellor remarked.

He added that the initiative is expected to strengthen the partnership between the University and the Bank and create a sustainable framework for future collaborations.

In a chat with UNILORIN Bulletin shortly after the meeting, the Chief Digital Officer of the Bank, Mr Abdullahi Popoola, enumerated some of the numerous benefits of the planned smart cards for students of the University of Ilorin.

According to Mr Popoola, the smart card integrates multiple functionalities, combining identity verification, payment capabilities, and access control to facilities on campus, adding that students will enjoy rebates and discounts when they use the card to pay for certain products and services.

While noting that students and staff currently use separate ID cards and ATM cards, which do not provide them with any special privilege, the bank official said the new smart card addresses these gaps by functioning as a three-in-one solution.

Mr Popoola also explained that "the card cannot be counterfeited, which is a major advantage. It carries unique security features recognised worldwide. We are also establishing partnerships nationwide to ensure that University of Ilorin students enjoy discounts and other
