# Summit commends UNILORINs sterling contributions to D-8's development

The eight countries that make up the D-8 NPRI are Bangladesh, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan, and Turkey. Apart from the University of Ilorin, six other Nigerian universities are also members of the Network. They are: Usmanu Danfodio University, Sokoto; Bayero University, Kano, Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile Ife; the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, Ahamadu Bello University, Zaria and the University of Maiduguri.

Mr Ahmar noted that the University of Ilorin, with over 50,000 students, is one of Nigeria's leading and oldest universities. He commended the institution's remarkable initiative in hosting the D-8 countries and steering them towards adopting the charter.

The diplomat, who acknowledged UNILORIN's contributions since joining the D-8 NPRI, noted that its efforts would always be remembered in the history of the Network

He expressed confidence that the initiative would establish effective linkages

among the 28 member-universities from the eight member countries, advancing research and innovation while generating employment for the youth of member countries. He further pointed out that the collaboration would enhance the social, cultural, and economic development of D-8 nations.

Mr Ahmar, who previously served as the Consul-General at the Pakistan Consulate in Birmingham, UK, stated that once the Network is fully established and operational, it would generate significant momentum through the collaborative efforts of the 28 member-universities. These institutions would communicate and collaborate in areas of research and innovation, leveraging their comparative strengths across the D-8 countries to achieve efficient progress.

The diplomat pointed out that various universities in the D-8 countries are already engaged in research, innovation, and developing new inventions, as well as working on harmonising curricula and facilitating student exchanges.

Mr Ahmar said through the

Network, students from the 28 member universities would gain opportunities to experience diverse societies, cultures, and teaching methodologies. He stated further that the goal of harmonising curricula across member universities was to ensure the dissemination of the latest knowledge and advancements consistently.

While expressing pride in being in Ilorin, Mr Ahmar commended the University of Ilorin for taking a leadership role in hosting the D-8 NPRI Summit. He described the campus as exceptional, noting that the facilities, departments, and student population surpassed the expectations of the delegates. He was optimistic that all D-8 countries would benefit from the achievements, innovations, and research generated through the Network.

Earlier in his remarks during the opening session of the Summit, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, expressed the institution's delight at being part of the initiative and hosting the Summit, especially as the University was the newest member of the Network. Prof. Egbewole also acknowledged the support of the Ambassador of Bangladesh and the Consular Officer from Indonesia, pointing out that their presence affirmed the commitment of the member countries to the Network's vision.

He noted that in 2020, the organisation resolved to focus on research and innovation, leading to the establishment of the D-8 Network for Pioneering Research and Innovation (NPRI), adding that the Network currently has 28 member universities across the eight member countries.

The Vice Chancellor revealed that the Summit deliberated on the D-8 NPRI Charter, which is expected to be adopted as the 'Ilorin Charter'. He noted that the Charter would outline how members relate with one another, operate, and shape the Network's future while creating a roadmap for members' engagement.

The renowned Professor of

Jurisprudence and International Law stated that the goal of the Network is to reposition research, innovation, and development within the D-8 countries.

While saying that partnerships among member countries would include student and staff exchanges, joint research collaborations, and joint study projects, Prof. Egbewole explained that linkages between universities and industries would be established to foster a conducive environment for job creation and reducing youth unemployment across the D-8 countries.

The Vice-Chancellor appreciated the Local Organising Committee, chaired by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Technology, and Innovation) of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Adegboyega Adisa Fawole, for the Summit's success. He also commended the D-8 NPRI Secretariat for considering the University of Ilorin as the host of the Summit.

In a goodwill message, the High

Commissioner of Bangladesh to Nigeria, H.E. Masudur Rahman, expressed gratitude to the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin for the excellent arrangements made for the 3rd NPRI Summit.

### Yahaya tasks students on contribution to national development

he Dean of the Faculty of Education, University of Ilorin, Prof. Lasiele Alabi Yahaya, has urged students of the Department of Health Promotion and Environmental Health Education to use the knowledge they gain in the course of their studies to make substantial contributions to national development.

Prof. Yahaya made this call penultimate Thursday (November 21, 2024) during the World Diabetes Day 2024 celebration organised by the Diabetes Association of Nigeria, Kwara State Chapter, in collaboration with the Department of Health and Environmental Health Education. The event took place at the Education Lecture Theatre.

Prof. Yahaya, who was represented by Prof. Yunus Fasasi, expressed pride in the achievements of the Department and encouraged the students to focus on their studies.

He said that upon graduation, they would be equipped to play an essential role in shaping the nation's health landscape.

The Dean also advised students to maintain good character, foster positive relationships with their lecturers, and remain focused on their academic and professional goals, noting that "the Department moulds future nation builders and leaders."

The Guest Speaker, Prof. Olukunmi Lanre Olaitan of the Department of Health Promotion and Environmental Health Education, who spoke on the theme "Sweet, but Bitter: The Travail of Mellitus on Learning Outcomes and Job Productivity", noted that 1.2 million people die from diabetes annually.

Prof. Olaitan, who stressed the importance of prevention and awareness, urged the audience to avoid sugary foods to prevent the "bitter" consequences of diabetes.

A Consultant Physician and Endocrinologist at the University of Ilorin

Teaching Hospital (UITH), Dr. Nasiru Sanni, spoke on "Breaking Barriers and Bridging the Gap", lamented the lack of awareness on diabetes in many African communities, pointing out that many individuals are unaware that they have the condition.

Dr Sanni warned that untreated diabetes can lead to serious health complications, including erectile dysfunction, foot ulcers, stroke, and kidney disease. He encouraged the audience to undergo regular health checkups rather than waiting for symptoms to appear. (Contd. on page 7)











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# Abikoye canvasses tighter information security

She explained that the primary objective of information security is to protect valuable assets such as data, hardware and software and physical devices from being manipulated by unauthorised agents, saying that personal data must be protected against unauthorised access, disclosure and change of destination.

Prof. Abikoye pointed out that "it is important that sensitive information is protected in an increasingly interconnected digital world due to the dynamic nature of threats such as cyber attacks, insider threats and social engineering."

She added that advancement in the internet and intranet technologies have brought about the proliferation of various types of businesses such as e-commerce, banking and finance and even software operations.

The Inaugural Lecturer stressed the necessity of periodic changes of passwords by users in order to protect treasured information from being illegally accessed.

She said that the passwords must be changed on a quarterly basis, saying that it is one of the surest ways by which access to it by unauthorised persons can be effectively prevented.

Prof. Abikoye also encouraged employers of labour to embark on consistent training and retraining of their workforces, adding that organisation of cybersecurity awareness programmes for them would prevent their information from being hacked by criminally minded people.

She also called for the establishment of incident response plans and conduct of routine security assessments and audits in every corporate organisation.

Prof. Abikoye equally canvassed the promotion of a culture of security awareness within organisations, saying that when members of an organisation are properly tutored such places would be firmly protected.

She similarly called for the application of cutting-edge technologies such as ML, AI and behavioral analytics to detect and reduce security risks in

workplaces.

The renowned cyber security expert also advocated the introduction and inculcation of organisational planning, cyber hygiene, and healthy cybersecurity in work behaviours within corporate organisations.

To ensure responsible handling of sensitive information, Prof. Abikoye called for increased focus on privacy regulations, compliance frameworks, and data governance.

The Inaugural Lecturer also stressed the need for researchers, professionals, and policymakers to consider what he called "watermarking" to safeguard the intellectual property of NNs in various domains, including finance, healthcare, and national security.

Prof. Abikoye also called on the government to adopt biometric traits such as the human iris for national identification and recognition systems.

She also said that the introduction of liveliness detection as part of measures to enhance the security of information and improve the biometrics system in all

agencies, parastatals, and organisations would enhance service delivery.

The don equally canvassed the consistent use of both biometrics and cryptography systems to prevent biometric vulnerabilities.

She added that information security experts should raise public awareness regarding the risks of submitting personal data to websites and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), outlining its usage and consequences for violators.

For a greater quality service delivery to pensioners, Prof. Abikoye advised the government to introduce a voice recognition system to the "Am Alive" verification programme.

The Inaugural Lecture, which was presided over by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Management Services), Prof. Suleiman Ambali, was attended by dignitaries from far and near including traditional rulers, colleagues, relations, friends and students of Prof. Abikoye.

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Govt's economic policies inspire hope of a brighter future - Expert

he Chief Innovation Officer of Quaranos Technology Limited, Mr Segun Maleghemi, has said that the government's ongoing economic diversification activities through continued efforts in agriculture, mining, and technology sectors promise to reduce the contry's dependence on oil revenue.

Mr Maleghemi stated this penultimate Wednesday (November 20, 2022) while delivering the 2024 Annual Public Lecture of the Faculty of Management Sciences, University of Ilorin, themed "Government Economic Policies: Prospects, Challenges and the Way Forward for Businesses and Households".

He pointed out that to create more balanced economic growth, Nigeria needs diversification to enhance the value of both oil and non-oil sectors, saying that the non-oil sector is growing faster to achieve sustainable economic growth.

The company executive, however, noted that oil theft has severely impacted the oil sector, causing production to fall to 1.16 million barrels per day in November 2022, which is much below the OPEC quota and explained that the world is currently experiencing high oil prices due to the Ukraine war while Nigeria's gas resources remain largely unexplored.

Mr Maleghemi noted that the COVID-19 pandemic underscored the importance of substantial foreign reserves and fiscal savings for economic resilience and noted that this does not have to come with incurring heavy debts.

The technocrat said that while the manufacturing sector is critical for job creation and sustainable growth, it faces significant challenges as he encouraged stakeholders not to neglect the sector.

He argued that government must prioritise battle against oil theft as a national emergency to maximise revenue, especially given the fact that non-oil growth remains slow

He observed that despite the current challenges, Nigeria's economy is attracting significant investor interest through young tech-savvy entrepreneurs, a growing middle class, and supportive government initiatives in key sectors such as fintech and real estate, which are offering strong returns.

Also speaking, the General Manager of Kam Industries, Mr Abdulfatah Adeyemi, urged the government to streamline taxation so that businesses would be able to make profit and give adequate taxes to both the state and federal government.

He noted that the Manufacturers Association of Nigeria (MAN) had submitted that multiple taxation is hindering the growth of businesses in Nigeria.

In his welcome address, the Dean of the Faculty of Management Sciences, Prof. R. A. Gbadeyan, said that the role of the academia is to remain at the forefront of intellectual exploration while connecting with the realities of the industry. He noted that government's economic policies directly impact the lives of individuals, households, and businesses.

In his contribution to the discourse, the Chairman of the Organising Committee, Professor Abubakar Sadiq Kasum, noted that the way forward to address the nation's current economic challenges and capitalise on opportunities is to strengthen policy consistency and implementation.

Other scholars who spoke at the event agreed that the government must immediately stop inflation to give respite to the nation and its citizens.

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# UNILORIN and the 3rd D-8 NPRI Summit

or four days last week (Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> to Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> November), the University of Ilorin once again showcased its research prowess, organisational skill, and superlative hospitality to the global community, as it hosted the 3<sup>rd</sup> Summit of the D-8 Network of Pioneers for Research and Innovation (D-8 NPRI). The Network is one of the key organs of the 27 year-old Developing Eight (D-8) Organisation for Economic Cooperation. It comprises 28 universities across eight developing countries of Bangladesh, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan and Turkey.

Hosting the 3<sup>rd</sup> D-8 NPRI Summit is a big plus for the University of Ilorin that is poised to join the league of the 500 universities of note in the world, according to the Egbewole Administration's ambitious Vision 1: 10: 500.
