Egbewole unveils 30 new shuttle buses

Egbewole seeks stronger collaboration with DSS

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has advocated continued collaboration between the University and the Kwara State Command of the Department of State Services (DSS) to safeguard the lives and property of staff and students of the institution.

The Vice Chancellor urged the Centre for Research, Development, and In-House Training (CREDIT) and the Centre for International Education (CIE) not to relent in identifying grant opportunities and sharing them with the staff members.

Noting that his Administration had cleared a backlog of £6,000 in membership dues to the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU), the Vice Chancellor said it is expected to lead to significant benefits through grant applications.

He explained the various opportunities available through organisations such as the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU), the Association of African Universities (AAU), and many other international funding organisations.

He said, "We have opportunities from the Association of Commonwealth Universities, Association of African Universities, and many granting agencies. While some colleagues are accessing these grants, unfortunately, a few are doing so in ways that could harm our system."

Commenting on the revival of the In-House Committee meeting, the Vice Chancellor noted that the gathering, which serves as the engine room of the University for decision-making, has been revitalised under his leadership, holding its third session since he assumed office. He said that the Committee's purpose is to drive systemic improvements, document achievements, and ensure that all directorates and units provide quarterly reports to measure progress.

Prof. Egbewole encouraged the University staff to take ownership of their roles, likening them to Vice Chancellors within their respective units. He also stressed the importance of timely and efficient execution of duties, adding that a change in attitude will positively impact the overall performance of the University.

Speaking on the enforcement of Dress Code, the Vice Chancellor urged the Deans, Heads of Departments and Directors to address dress code compliance within their various Faculties, Departments and Units, noting that it is a collective responsibility, not solely that of the Registrar or a Committee

Commenting on the digitisation and internationalisation agenda, the Senior Advocate of Nigeria mentioned the University's strides in digitisation, including a redesigned portal and the

rollout of smart ID cards. He also reported positive outcomes of the University's internationalisation agenda, as he shared optimism about its continued success, adding that some of the administration's international travels have been self-sponsored, underlining a commitment to achieving institutional goals while ensuring financial responsibility.

Earlier, the Director of Unilorin Holdings, Prof. Bashir Ademola Raji, provided an update on the newly introduced Smart ID Card. He said, "The Smart ID card, introduced by the University, starting with the students, aligns with the Vice Chancellor's automation policy. The card is designed with multiple functionalities, including taking attendance in class, recording attendance for Senate members during meetings, gaining access to official meetings and other restricted areas, serving as a wallet for banking activities, among others. Additionally, the Smart ID card enables cashless payments for the campus shuttle buses, as each bus is equipped with a POS terminal.

Commenting further on the Smart ID Card initiative, the Vice Chancellor said it is one of the efforts being made to enhance affordability and convenience for staff and students. He said, "As part of our discussions, we recognise that some of our staff patronise major retail outlets across the country. We are exploring discounts with select franchises and airlines operating within Nigeria to offer additional benefits to our community".

He also announced the launch of a pilot programme tied to the campus shuttle system. "The pilot began this morning with the campus shuttle. We are introducing 30 new buses to ease transportation challenges, and the park will be relocated to the gate to enhance security and ensure

affordability".

Furthermore, the Vice Chancellor announced the integration of a work-study programme, which allows students to engage in productive roles while studying. He said, "Students will be involved in work-study activities such as driving or serving as monitors or officials for the shuttle system. This initiative enables them to 'earn while they learn. The work-study programme is being expanded across various units, including the Works Unit, PPU, Unilorin Holdings, the Institute of Education, and the Library. Through this initiative, students can earn stipends while contributing meaningfully to university operations," he added.

The Vice Chancellor also addressed the issue of staff leaving the University without proper notice, saying that this attitude has negative impact on the Institution. He, however, stated that some of the concerned staff members have begun to resign.

He said, "While we are not against anyone seeking opportunities abroad, such as going to the U.S., UK, to work and earn a living, it is essential that we are formally informed of your departure. This allows us to fill the vacant positions promptly."

On security enhancement, Prof. Egbewole acknowledged the improved security measures, including the provision of nearly 500 solar lamps across the campus, saying that this has exceeded the Strategic Plan's target of 400. He also noted an increase in security personnel and facilities, with expectations for more vehicles to bolster safety on campus.

The Vice Chancellor, expressed optimism that the scheme would blossom, noting that the new transportation scheme will be affordable, and efficient. He added that the scheme would also enhance the ease of movement of students and staff, as well as address security issues within the

campus.

The Vice Chancellor also explained the importance of integrity in the operation of the initiative, saying, "We have designed strategies to identify those who may attempt to cut corners. As responsible staff and students, we must uphold our core values, one of which is integrity. Let us be guided by these values when patronising this initiative."

Prof. Egbewole further said, "The only way this initiative will succeed is by adopting an integrity-driven approach. This is why we aim to make the system as cashless as possible, to enable us to track daily passenger numbers and ensure transparency in revenue allocation

to the investor."

In a chat with *UNILORIN Bulletin*, the Ag. Dean of Student Affairs, Dr Alex Akanmu, commended the Vice-Chancellor on his efforts in improving transportation within the University.

Dr Akanmu noted that while there is still progress to be made, the University has come a long way in addressing transportation challenges. He emphasised that the initiative has the potential to expand further, benefiting both students and staff alike.

The Dean observed that the

introduction of the new campus shuttles marks a significant development by providing an affordable and efficient transportation system for the University Community, adding that the initiative also aims at curbing extortion and create a more student — staff friendly commuting experience.

Dr Akanmu announced that certified drivers among the students would be part of the drivers for the new shuttle buses. He said, "Such students will work 40 hours per month, as practiced in developed countries. The arrangement has been made to ensure that the working hours do not affect their study hours. This arrangement is in line with the 'study-and-work' initiative of the Vice Chancellor."

Also speaking, the President of the Student Union, Comrade Agezeh Victor, said, "Students will be the drivers of all the new buses and they will be paid for the service rendered, which is in consonance with the work-and-study policy of Prof. Egbewole-led Administration.

The Student Union President also appreciated the Vice Chancellor and his management team for fulfilling promises

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UNILORIN Management clarifies position on Alumni rift

he Management of the University of Ilorin has said that it was fully aware of the change in leadership of the Institution's Alumni Association with the election of a new Executive Committee, led by Prof. Abdulrazaq Olubusuyi Kilani, on August 24, 2024.

It has, therefore, condemned the actions of Dr Wale Fasakin, who has continued to parade himself as the Association's President.

Making this clarification while speaking with newsmen in Ilorin yesterday, the Director of Corporate Affairs, Mr Kunle Akogun, said that the tenure of Dr Fasakin "came to an end in 2021 through a resolution of the Association's Congress." He added that "a Caretaker Committee was, thereafter, put in place and it ran the affairs of the Association till the August 2024 Congress where the new Kilani-led exco was elected".

But the former President was reported recently to have led some people on what they called a 'courtesy visit' to an alumna of the University, the Comptroller General of the Nigerian

Immigration Services, Mrs Kemi Nandap, claiming that the visit was by the National Executive Committee of the Unilorin Alumni Association.

Mr Akogun said, "Even though the

University Management does not want to dabble into the internal affairs of the Alumni Association, it can no longer sit back and watch the existing unity in the Association destroyed by needless wrangling."

The University spokesman noted that "the Management appreciates the relevance of the Association and its potential to make positive contributions to the overall development of the University and so it would stridently continue to find a way of promoting internal peace and harmony within the Association.

While calling on Dr Fasakin to stop parading himself as National President of the Unilorin Alumni Association, especially as a new executive committee is already in place, Mr Akogun "urged all corporate organisations, government officials, and other well-meaning individuals, as well as stakeholders of the University to stop giving audience to Dr Fasakin or transacting any business with him, as he has ceased to be an official of the Association and so, is no longer in any position to represent it".

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New campus shuttle service to complement, not replace commercial buses - VC

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has assured commercial bus drivers operating on the University campus that the newly inaugurated Campus Shuttle Service will not negatively affect their business.

Prof. Egbewole gave this assurance last Monday (January 6, 2025) during a meeting he held with the commercial bus drivers operating at the University Auditorium.

Addressing the concerns of the drivers, the Vice Chancellor explained that the meeting was convened to dispel misinformation suggesting that the Campus Shuttle was introduced to replace their services.

While expressing appreciation to the commercial bus drivers for their efforts in conveying students and staff to and from the campus over the years, Prof. Egbewole clarified that the new shuttle buses were introduced to ease transportation challenges facing the University's growing student and staff population.

"We are aware that many of you are parents, and some of you have children studying here. We want for your children the same comfort and convenience we desire for other students", the Vice Chancellor said, adding that "the Campus Shuttle initiative is not designed to displace you but to complement your services and make life easier for our students."

Prof. Egbewole stated further, "If we want to achieve development, we must always listen to the complaints of our students, who are our customers, because the customer is king. Our students are the reason we are here as staff, and their existence is the reason you are also here. If we fail to respond to their demands, we might be jeopardising our jobs."

The Vice Chancellor urged the drivers to continue with their legitimate

operations on campus while treating students with respect and recognising their role as key stakeholders in the system. He said, "Our students are at the core of everything we do. Their needs must always be a priority for all of us."

Also speaking during the meeting, the Ag. Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. Alex Akanmu, applauded the thoughtfulness of the Vice Chancellor in initiating the meeting to douse the tension among the commercial bus drivers plying the University.



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VC laments Africa's lag in adopting Al

he Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has lamented Africa's lag in adopting artificial Intelligence (AI) and called for urgent measures to accelerate its integration across the continent.

Speaking at a Workshop on Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Referencing Managers organised by the Department of Chemistry, Faculty of Physical Sciences last Wednesday (January 8, 2025), Prof. Egbewole noted that while the global conversation has progressed to artificial general intelligence (AGI) and artificial super intelligence (ASI), Africa remains focused on the basics of AI.

The Vice Chancellor opined that the workshop was aimed at exploring effective and ethical ways to integrate AI into academic and professional work without compromising originality or engaging in plagiarism.

Prof. Egbewole expressed the hope that the workshop would enlighten participants on how to utilise AI technology responsibly and productively, saying, "Instead of using the technology in a way that portrays us as ingenious or fake, I believe this workshop will open our eyes to better ways of harnessing its potential".

The Vice Chancellor also applauded the Department for the integration of global perspectives through virtual participation by attendees from outside Nigeria. He said, "We didn't limit ourselves to the geographical boundaries of Nigeria; we leveraged technology to involve participants globally, which means we are actually drawing knowledge from a broader spectrum".

Prof. Egbewole encouraged

Let's integrate technology into research, training -- Egbewole

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has reiterated the indispensability of technology in modern research and teaching, urging researchers to integrate it into their academic activities.

He made this assertion last Wednesday (January 8, 2025) while declaring open the Faculty of Clinical Sciences' Public Lecture and Research Workshop, organised in collaboration with the Offa Descendants' Union North America (ODUNA), at the University Auditorium.

While explaining the indispensability of technology in driving institutional processes and societal advancements, Prof. Egbewole said technology has come to stay, and it is now a necessity, not an option.

While expressing optimism about the outcomes of the lecture, Prof. Egbewole said, "It is my hope that by the end of this lecture, we will have actionable strategies to improve our teaching and research methods. More importantly, we must extend the benefits of these innovations to our communities, ensuring that the impact of our work is felt in the society."

The Vice Chancellor commended the collaboration between the Faculty of Clinical Sciences and ODUNA, describing it as a significant milestone in the University's drive for meaningful partnerships. He said, "For deeming it fit to collaborate with ODUNA to organise this Public Lecture, I extend my heartfelt commendations. This partnership reflects

the priorities of this Administration, which is deeply committed to fostering impactful collaborations."

In his lecture, titled "Living Life on a Mission: Career Path of an Intervention Radiologist", the Guest Lecturer, Dr Hammed Ninalowo, charged stakeholders in the Country to prioritise collaboration between government agencies, private investors, and academic institutions as the possible way of advanced medicine in Nigeria.

Dr Ninalowo, a renowned medical expert in the field of interventional Radiology, underscored the immense potential Nigeria holds in achieving globally competitive healthcare standards, adding that advance medicine is possible in Nigeria only if people are ready to sacrifice.

He emphasised the importance of strategic investment in infrastructure, training, and research, coupled with the efficient use of local resources.

Dr Ninalowo also commended the University of Ilorin for fostering academic excellence and creating platforms for meaningful dialogue on pressing healthcare issues, adding that "Institutions like UNILORIN play a critical role in shaping the future of healthcare by nurturing talents and driving research."

Earlier in his welcome address, the Dean of the Faculty of Clinical Sciences,

Prof. Lukman O. Abdurrahman, said that the Faculty is committed to addressing the healthcare needs of Nigerians through research, education, and community service.

Prof. Abdurrahman stressed the need for a multi-faceted approach to tackling the country's healthcare challenges, such as inadequate healthcare infrastructure, shortage of healthcare personnel, and limited access to healthcare services.

He also highlighted the importance of collaboration between the academia, healthcare providers, and the community in finding solutions to the country's healthcare challenges.

While explaining that the Public Lecture was part of the efforts of the Faculty to promote healthcare development and education in Nigeria, the Dean said that the Faculty of Clinical Sciences has established itself as a center of excellence in medicalology education and research in Nigeria.

Prof. Abdurrahman said that by seeking solutions to the country's healthcare challenges, the Faculty is demonstrating its commitment to improving the health and well-being of the Nigerian people.

Speaking on behalf of the ODUNA, the Acting Director of the University Health Services, Dr Rasheed Odunola, appreciated the University for accommodating the Association, which he said was established to address health issues of Offa indigenes and other Nigerians at home and abroad.

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UNILORIN moves to boost resource base ...Inaugurates Advancement Board

he Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has inaugurated the University Advancement Board with a mandate to strengthen the institution's resource base through strategic resource mobilisation, partnerships, and endowments.

The inauguration ceremony, held last Friday (January 10, 2025), at the University Auditorium was attended by Principal Officers,

Council Members, the Committee of Provost and Deans, Directors of Centres and Units, Union Leaders, Alumni Association executives, Student Union leaders, and other stakeholders.

The Board is chaired by Dr. Abdulwahab A. Ibrahim, FCA, with Alhaji Bolaji Elelu and Mr. Abiodun Adediran Olatunji, SAN, serving as members. Statutory members of the Board include the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Management Services), who will serve as the Vice-Chancellor's Representative and Alternate Chairman; the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), the Bursar, the University Librarian, and the Registrar, who will serve as the Secretary of the Board. They will be joined by the University Internal Auditor, one member of Senate, one member of Congregation, one member of Convocation, and the Director of Advancement Centre.

In his address, the Vice Chancellor explained that the Board's membership was selected based on values such as integrity, excellence, courage, and commitment, adding that the inclusion of alumni representatives, demonstrate the University's confidence in its graduates' capacity to contribute significantly to its advancement.

While reaffirming the University's aspiration to "produce globally competitive graduates who are equipped to make meaningful impacts in their respective fields", the Vice Chancellor said, "The University Advancement Board will be instrumental in helping us achieve this vision."

Prof. Egbewole pointed out that the establishment of the Board is particularly timely as the University prepares to celebrate its golden jubilee this year, saying, "This body represents a convergence of talent, expertise, and dedication, comprising leaders from the academia, industry, government, and other sectors." He added that "the

Advancement Board will serve as a bridge between the University and the broader society we are committed to serving".

Listing its terms of reference, the Vice Chancellor said that the University Advancement Board would develop strategies to enhance the University's Fundraising and Partnership Initiatives; identify and pursue opportunities to expand the University's influence and impact; oversee and support fundraising campaigns, sponsorships, and other resource mobilisation efforts; and identify and cultivate relationships with potential donors, corporate sponsors, and philanthropic entities.

The Board was also mandated to foster strong relationships with alumni, community members, industry leaders, and other stakeholders; promote initiatives that build goodwill and strengthen stakeholder trust; monitor the effectiveness of advancement strategies and campaigns; and ensure alignment of advancement activities with the University's vision, mission, values, and goals.

In his inaugural speech, the Chairman of the Advancement Board, Dr. Abdulwahab A. Ibrahim, expressed his gratitude for the opportunity to serve the University and pledged the Board's unwavering commitment to advancing the institution.

Dr. Ibrahim assured stakeholders that the Board would focus its energy on fulfilling its mandate, assuring that those who placed their trust in the Board would have no cause for regret.

He said, "We are here to serve, and we will do nothing but serve", pointing out that "this Board comprises individuals with the capacity to deliver on the terms of our appointment. These terms are designed to advance the course of the University, ensuring it continues to achieve its goals and becomes even better".
