The University's highest decision-making body equally approved the appointment of Professors Is'haq Oloyede, Olu Obafemi, and Musbau Akanji as Emeritus Professors. The three were picked from about 28 applications received from the various Faculties.

ODUNA partners UNILORIN to facilitate linkages with US institutions

The University of Ilorin and the Offa Descendants' Union North America (ODUNA) have formalised a partnership agreement with the signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) aimed at facilitating staff and student exchange programmes, as well as facilitating linkages with institutions in the United States of America.

The MoU signing, which was witnessed by Principal Officers of the University and ODUNA Executive Committee members, held last Tuesday (January 21, 2025) at the Committee Room of the Office of the Vice-Chancellor.

Speaking at the ceremony, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, expressed his gratitude to ODUNA for initiating this collaborative relationship.

Prof. Egbewole said that the goal of the University is to bridge the gap between the academia and industries, adding that the partnership with ODUNA has the potential to benefit the students, staff, and the entire university system.

According to him, "Even if the exchange facilitates relationship with hospitals in the US, our students and staff will gain exposure to advanced facilities and opportunities. I encourage us all to be deliberate in our decisions to maximise the benefits of this collaboration".

The Vice Chancellor also praised ODUNA for its long-standing contributions to the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital (UITH), as he shared optimism that the MoU would lead to fruitful outcomes for all parties involved.

Speaking earlier, the Director of the Centre for International Education (CIE), University of Ilorin, Prof. Ibraheem Lateef Onireti, outlined ODUNA's vision for the partnership.

He revealed that the MoU includes plans to facilitate the involvement of renowned US-based academics as resource persons for the annual special Faculty Lecture at the Faculty of Clinical Sciences; establish linkages with US-based academic institutions and professional bodies to provide adjunct

lecturing opportunities for qualified ODUNA academics; create exchange internship and research fellowship opportunities for qualified students of the University of Ilorin, among others.

Speaking during the meeting, the President of ODUNA, Mr Abdulmajeed Lawal, explained the Association's goals of supporting initiatives that benefit the University of Ilorin, ODUNA, and the communities in Kwara State.

Mr Lawal noted that ODUNA has been providing healthcare services through annual outreach programmes for the past decade. He said, "The impact has been significant, and we are now expanding our scope. Collaborating with the University of Ilorin, a 'Better by Far' institution, is a step towards achieving our broader goals."

In his own remarks, a former President of ODUNA, Dr Adegboyega Abdulkadir, explained the importance of engaging Nigerians and Kwarans in the Diaspora to contribute to the development of the country. He said there are many

Nigerians, particularly Kwarans, who can bring valuable resources and expertise back to the country, pointing out that "this is an area where we think we can combine our ideas to improve society".

Dr Abdulkadir further explained that ODUNA has maintained an MoU with the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital (UITH) for the past nine years, during which they have achieved significant milestones. "Through cooperation, we've had staff from UITH and the University of Ilorin volunteer in our outreach programmes. We've also donated equipment, medications, textbooks, and other essential items. We believe it's time to build on these achievements and take our efforts to the next level," Dr Abdulkadir stated.

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

The two crucial decisions were the major highlights of the 304th Special Meeting of the University Senate, held last Thursday (January 23, 2025).

In his remarks, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, announced that the current Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Technology, and Innovation), Prof. Adegboyega Adisa Fawole, will be recommended to the University Governing Council for confirmation as the next Deputy Vice Chancellor (Management Services). He also disclosed that Prof. Odunola-Bakare would serve as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic) while Prof. Etudaiye would serve as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology, and Innovation), subject to the Council's approval.

A renowned Professor of Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Odunola-Bakare is currently the Director of the Centre for Management and Leadership (CML). She is also the immediate past Dean of the Postgraduate School.

Prof. Etudaiye, on his part, is a Professor of Jurisprudence and International Law and current Chairman of the University Admissions Committee.

Prof. Egbewole commended the outgoing Deputy Vice Chancellors, Prof. Omotesho and Prof. Ambali, for their dedication and loyalty. He said, "I am saying this with a full sense of responsibility, these gentlemen are very loyal to the system, and when you talk about loyalty to the system, you are talking about loyalty to the leader. I do not take this for granted. Their commitment has never been in doubt for even a second. They have the courage to express their views, even when the leader proposes or suggests something they do not accept for valid reasons. They never shy away from explaining their position or disagreement, despite their loyalty".

The Vice Chancellor said that "the

Principal Officers have worked as a team from the day they joined this administration until this moment. Whenever we had disagreements, we sat down to resolve them, and when we agreed on issues, they pursued these matters even more vigorously than the originator of the idea, even when they initially disagreed. They are workaholics. By nature, I am impatient, restless, and always on the move, yet they have kept pace with me all along. I say thank you".

Prof. Egbewole stated further, "They see the leader as someone who can do no wrong, and that has sustained us this far. Ultimately, this approach has brought us the accolades we are receiving all around. They give honest, uncoloured, and selfless advice to the leader. They never provide advice with ulterior motives. On behalf of the Senate, I thank them. They are appointees of the Council, and the Council will organise a befitting send-off for them as Deputy Vice-Chancellors."

Also paying tribute to the outgoing Deputy Vice Chancellors, the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Prof. Biodun Sulyman Alabi, said both men have diligently served the University, and their efforts will forever be appreciated.

According to him, "Prof. Omotesho is a detribulised Nigerian who works equally and effectively with Muslims and Christians. I even met him at the Ilorin Forum. Prof. Ambali, on his part, is a prominent member of Tripartite, an informal organisation that has been stabilising the University system over the years. What transpired in this Senate is part of the Tripartite agreement. I wish both of you the best of luck".

On her part, the Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences, Prof. Adedoyin Jolaade Omede, appreciated Prof. Omotesho's sense of humility. She said, "When I came in, it felt like we were going into war with the Administration, but with the conversation I had with Prof. Omotesho, I was reassured, and the matter of dispute was resolved. Prof. Sulaiman Ambali, on his part, is an expert in diffusing tension. I remember how he facilitated the repair and maintenance of our Faculty car. He gives you hope and assures you of better results. He is the kind of man women admire because he makes serious issues look simple".

Also in his own tribute, the Director of the Computer Services and Information Technology Unit (COMSIT), Prof. Rasheed Gbenga Jimoh, said he would miss Prof. Omotesho more than anyone else in the system because of the way he supported his office. He added that whatever the institution has achieved as a university in terms of digital transformation, the credit should go to Prof. Omotesho as Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academic.

Prof. Jimoh said, "Prof. Omotesho will call you in the middle of the night; he will not allow you to sleep until the issue observed is resolved. As a university, we underwent two migrations: one from the hosting platform and another from the old portal to the new portal. These are exercises that could destabilise the University if mishandled. But because of his commitment and passion for this system, Prof. Omotesho works as if he is a graduate assistant to achieve results. He is someone qualified to be a mentor because he has served as Dean, HOD, and Director of Academic Planning. But when he is working, you wouldn't know he is our senior. He is the epitome of humility, so committed to the University, and passionate about its progress.'

While paying tribute to Prof. Ambali, the Director of COMSIT said, "I see him as a loyal lieutenant because the moment the Vice Chancellor gives a directive, Prof. Ambali is already executing it. What I have seen in him is that he is a committed and loyal lieutenant who follows the principal's instructions without hesitation."

Prof. Egbewole said, "There was a time when the University came back to him to serve as Dean. Ordinarily, the position of Dean is belittling for someone who had served as Provost, but because of his love for the system, he agreed. And that is one of the things I want us to learn from him. Since becoming Vice Chancellor, he has always regarded and respected me because of the office that I occupy. What that teaches is humility par excellence. Because whatever you are, you must recognise authority, and that is what Prof. Omotoso symbolises and preaches".

While reflecting on his personal connection with Prof. Omotoso, the Vice Chancellor said, "My being here today is divine. Whether I am Vice Chancellor or not, I would still be here because of my deep connection with my brother, mentor, and advisor. Prof. Omotoso is a supporter of positive values, and for those who have worked with him, I pray that God continues to honour you".

Describing Prof. Omotoso as "a wonderful human being", Prof. Egbewole highlighted his calm demeanor and thoughtful contributions during meetings. He said, "When he joins a discussion, everyone in the room is sure to agree with him. He is an encyclopedia of knowledge, a l w a y s r e m e m b e r i n g d a t e s, circumstances, and intricate details from past meetings".

In his tribute, the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology, and Innovation), Prof. Adegboyega Adisa Fawole, who is also the President of ILUMSA Alumni Association Worldwide, said his first encounter with Prof. Omotoso was in 1982 as a medical student. He said Prof. Omotoso, who was a young and brilliant teacher, taught him prescriptions in medicine, and since then, he has developed a love for him because the honouree made what seemed difficult at that time very simple.

Prof. Fawole described his retired teacher as "friendly, a good listener, and someone with a good and gentle smile", adding that "Prof. Omotoso handles his patients with such gentility, worthy of emulation."

The Deputy Vice Chancellor said that Prof. Omotoso demonstrated passion and thoroughness, adding that he is "a versatile administrator, a team player, who believes in inclusiveness with everyone partaking as stakeholders and contributing meaningfully with wise cracks, jokes and proverbs to make you say something. I held up my hands and he has led me on since, through the years, for this I am forever grateful".

As a social scientist, Prof. Fawole said Prof. Omotoso understands human behavior. "He walked us through the challenges of administration. He broke into administration with his appointment as the CMAC during the era of Prof. Olurotimi Omoniyi Fakeye (my main mentor), and from then on, he reached higher grounds through experience and commitment, most probably from native intelligence. Native intelligence can be acquired (abiso) or genetic (abimo). In the case of Prof. Omotoso, it is abimo. May you continue to enjoy the goodness and mercies of God."

On his part, a former Member of the Governing Council of the University of Ilorin and past Registrar of the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria, Prof. Bababode James Bojuwoye, praised Prof. Omotoso for his firm commitment to the University of Ilorin and to Nigeria. Prof. Bojuwoye stated that although Prof. Omotoso had opportunities to leave the country for greener pastures, he chose to remain in Nigeria, specifically at the University of Ilorin, due to his deep love for the institution, the university community, and his concern for the health needs of Nigerians.

While acknowledging that Prof. Omotoso had played a pivotal role in the advancement of the College of Health Sciences, by bringing innovative ideas and expertise that helped propel the College forward, the retired medical practitioner, academia, and administrator further expressed appreciation for Prof. Omotoso's loyalty to the University and his exceptional critical thinking skills. he Federal Government has appointed a former Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic) of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Nike Yetunde Sidikat Ijaiya, into the Presidential Advisory Committee on Prerogative of Mercy.

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The renowned academic and administrator would work with 11 other members selected from across the country on the Committee headed by the Attorney-General of the Federation and Minister of Justice, Prince Lateef Olasunkanmi Fagbemi, SAN.

In his tribute, the Chief Medical Director (CMD) of the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital, Prof. Abdullahi Dasliva Yussuf, who spoke through the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Prof. Sulyman Biodun Alabi, lauded the honouree for his exceptional contributions to both the medical and academic communities.

The CMD described Prof. Omotoso as a master strategist with an unparalleled attention to detail, emphasising his significant role as an outstanding administrator in the medical school and across Nigeria's academic landscape.

In his response, Prof. Omotoso expressed gratitude to everyone for their kind words and love for him and his family. He thanked his trainees for being wonderful students. He also thanked the staff of the University of Ilorin, the College of Health Sciences, and the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital (UITH), as well as the managements of these institutions for the trust and opportunity given him to serve in various capacities.

They spent several minutes talking about how the medical school at the University of Ilorin shaped their careers. We are already reaping the fruits of being teachers".

While urging the students of the College of Health Sciences to uphold the values of the Institution, the former Provost urged them to behave well. He said that the University of Ilorin is known for excellence, and the students are not just being trained to become doctors but to excel in both character and learning.

Reflecting on his personal journey, the Oluomo 1 of Ijurin-Ekiti in Ekiti State said, "If I had not gone into Medicine, perhaps I would have studied History or Law. I did History with all modesty in secondary school, and it turned out to be my best subject with an A1. History is part of me because you can't know or plan for the future if you don't understand where you are coming from. It is even good that the Federal Government has brought back History in our schools. Wherever you go, always remember the University of Ilorin."

Prof. Omotoso, who applauded his family for their unwavering love and support, said UNILORIN will forever hold a special place in their hearts. "I have children at the University of Ilorin. I started with three, which has now grown to six, and eight more have been added, with more on the way. This means that the University of Ilorin has a special bond with our family. We thank the University for giving us the opportunity to educate our children, from primary school to Unilorin Secondary School and finally, to the University of Ilorin for their higher education. In our house, we talk Unilorin, we eat Unilorin, and we enjoy being better by far. Thank you for this great honour," he concluded.

Make History a compulsory subject in schools -- Jawondo

The Director, Centre for Peace and Strategic Studies (CPSS), University of Ilorin, Prof. AbdulGaniyu Ibrahim Jawondo, has urged the Federal Government to rejig the nation's academic curricula and make the study of History in schools compulsory for every student.

Prof. Jawondo stated this penultimate Saturday (January 18, 2025) while speaking on a radio programme monitored by **UNILORIN Bulletin**.

The don, who is a former Director, Centre for Ilorin Studies (CILS), said that regardless of area of specialisation in academic pursuits, the study of History, as a subject, must be made compulsory to avoid distortion.

Prof. Jawondo pointed out that History should be an independent subject on the timetable for students.

He said, "I am begging government that they should not pair History with any other course on the

timetable. Let everybody, whether you are doing Science, Commerce, Engineering, whatever you are doing, History is very important. So, I think they should make it compulsory so that everybody will learn it."

The renowned academic, who is a former Head of the Department of History and International Studies at the University, alleged that those who were responsible for the removal of History from the academic curricula were enemies of the country. He added that the anti-History study elements did so to discourage people from knowing about the history and formation of the country and cover up their past.

He said, "You are discouraging people from knowing who you are, knowing what your community is all about, how you came about, how Nigeria is made up, how Africa is made up, what is the relationship between Africa and other continents. For those who did it, I think they meant to destroy this country. Only God saved us.

Going further, he said,"The reason is because the governance in Nigeria shifted significantly from those that you can say are 'born to rule' to those who became charismatic due to Western education or through another means and they found themselves in governance, and so they want to clear that area of their history that looks to be a little bit dirty, and they feel that the only way is to stop people from studying History so that people will not know their past".

She promised to make sure that the Department moves to the building as soon as possible.


Earlier, while handing over the project, the Contractor expressed his

Egbewole tasks PG students on responsible use of AI

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has urged the postgraduate students of the Institution to embrace the responsible use of technology in their academic pursuits, saying the University is committed to academic integrity and innovation.

Speaking during the orientation programme for new postgraduate students organised by the Postgraduate Students Association (POGSASS), last Tuesday (January 21, 2025), Prof. Egbewole pointed out the dual nature of technology, noting that while it offers immense benefits, it also comes with potential risks.

The Vice Chancellor specifically cautioned the students against the misuse of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools, saying, "Technology has positive values, and we want you to imbibe those positive values. However, it also has its downside, which is why we are appealing to you to avoid negative practices such as the misuse of AI. Artificial Intelligence is beneficial, but as Africans, we are still catching up with the rest of the world, which is already experiencing artificial general intelligence and artificial super intelligence. Meanwhile, we are still grappling with basic AI applications".

Prof. Egbewole warned that inappropriate use of AI could undermine the students' academic integrity. He said, "The way this technology is being used is creating problems for studentship, and that is why I am appealing to you. At UNILORIN, we have mechanisms in place to detect plagiarism, including whether you have copied your theses. We recently awarded a contract to procure an advanced plagiarism detection system to reinforce our stance on academic honesty."

While reaffirming the commitment of the University to excellence, Prof. Egbewole said that the "University of Ilorin appreciates excellence. Unilorin is built to be the best in Nigeria, and you are indeed very fortunate to be part of this great institution. We are driven by values encapsulated in the acronym INJECT: Integrity, Networking, Justice, Excellence, Commitment, and Teamwork. If you imbibe these values, your stay here will be meaningful, fruitful, and productive for you and the University".

In his remarks, the Dean of the Postgraduate School, Prof. Bamidele Victor Owoyele, said that the unilorin postgraduate programme is the best in Nigeria as he reaffirmed the commitment of the University to academic excellence and student success.

While noting the University's achievements, the Dean revealed that during the last academic session, the Institution produced 375 Ph. D. graduates, alongside numerous Master's degree and postgraduate diploma recipients. 

While appreciating the Vice Chancellor for honouring her and her family, Mrs Olabisi said, "We are so honoured to be invited to this meeting, and we appreciate it very much. If people who engage in immoral acts are being celebrated. I appreciate the fact that the University of Ilorin leadership deemed it fit to initiate this meeting. I believe that when young ones are celebrated, it serves as motivation and encouragement to their colleagues. I call her my succession plan because I didn't qualify until I was 39 years old. I didn't have the opportunity. My parents were not educated but were supportive in their own ways".

Mrs Olabisi said her daughter developed an interest in Accounting while she was a Business Studies teacher. "I would give her some scripts to mark, and from there she became familiar with the field. It hasn't been easy, but I always encouraged her because there was a point when she got discouraged. Combining schoolwork with ICAN was too much for her, but she scaled through".

The visibly elated Mrs. Olabisi, however, used the meeting to urge parents to look out for their children, especially when they are young. She said, "Not all mothers have the capacity to do what they need to do. My parents were well-to-do but, not literate. As a



mother, look out for the best in your child in every aspect. Always look out for what will benefit the child and make sure that child is aware of it. Even if we don't have awareness as parents, let us start exploring every opportunity that is out there for these kids and let us instill it in them as early as possible. When they grow with this mentality, they will be programmed to pursue great things. Children need to be encouraged from time to time. Lecturers and teachers are doing their best, but parents have a greater role to play in shaping the careers of their children".

Meanwhile, the Head of the Department of Accounting, Dr Abogun Segun, described Miss Faith Aduragbemi Olabisi as very industrious, hardworking, and humble, always ready to learn. He said, "As HOD, I have a lot of students who are doing their professional examinations. What stands her out is that she was able to achieve this at the tender age of 18. She is very industrious, hardworking, and humble, always ready to learn".

Dr Abogun also said that he felt excited that this happened during his time because it has brought the Department into the limelight. He added, "This is a recognition of the work that the lecturers are doing in the Department and the conducive environment provided by the Management of the University, because when someone attains such a height, there is a whole lot involved".





Egbewole hails Olabisi, 18-year-old chartered accountant Now I know why UNILORIN is called 'better by far' – Mother

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has celebrated Miss Faith Aduragbemi Olabisi, an 18-year-old student from the Department of Accounting, Faculty of Management Sciences, who recently passed the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nigeria (ICAN) examination, qualifying her as a chartered accountant.

While appreciating her mother for her unwavering support and encouragement, especially during challenging times, Miss Olabisi also thanked her lecturers for their understanding and support, particularly when she missed tests. She praised their generosity in allowing her to retake tests, which was vital to her success in the ICAN examination.

She said, "Every week I was calling her, crying. During the end of the second semester of my 200-level, I didn't go home for the entire two months. This is where I want to appreciate the management of the University of Ilorin, because while it is a tradition that hostels are locked when the School is on break, I was allowed to stay in the hostel, which assisted me a lot in achieving the feat".

When speaking about her motivation, Miss Olabisi revealed that her interest in accounting began at a young age. According to her, "I took interest since I was a little girl. I was determined to beat my mummy's record because she became a chartered accountant at 39, and I was determined to achieve the feat earlier than her. I always told her that I would love to be the youngest chartered accountant in Nigeria. A few years ago, I

This is the beginning of many more professional exams that I plan to write. I wish to achieve more before my graduation".

To her fellow Unilorites and all who might be inspired by her story, Miss Olabisi urged them to start working towards their goals and stay committed. She observed that if she could do it, they could do it even better. "Just start, read, stay focused, and continue to hope," she encouraged, sharing her belief that with determination, anyone can achieve their dreams.

On her part, the mother of the youngest Chartered Accountant, Mrs Titilayo Olabisi, appreciated the lecturers of the Department of Accounting at the University of Ilorin for being wonderful people who supported her daughter's dream. She said, "When some lecturers see their students pursuing something great, instead of encouraging and supporting such students, they make them their enemies. However, the lecturers of the Department of Accounting are very wonderful people. They conducted makeup tests for Faith when she missed them, and they don't schedule exams when there is an ICAN exam. I am especially grateful to her Level Adviser, Dr Yahya, who gave us the privilege to call him at any time. This is how a university should operate. They made me love Unilorin more, and I am happy that I chose the School for her. It is like home away from home for her. This is a school where you can leave your child and sleep with two eyes closed because you know they are in good hands. Thank you so much for making the peace of parents a priority"

While affirming that the University of Ilorin is, indeed, "Better by far," Mrs Olabisi said, "More so, I check her portal from time to time, and I have been encouraging my friends whose children are here to monitor their children's academic progress through their portals. Now I understand why you are called "Better by far". You are indeed better by far. I also love the bond among alumni of the University. They celebrate my daughter's success online as if they all know her somewhere before. This is a spirit that I love to see".

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
